In Preparation for Worship

What does it mean that Jesus “ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father”?

First, that Christ has gone to be with the Father, hidden except to the eyes of faith.

Second, however, that Christ is not cut off from us in the remote past, or in some place from which he cannot reach us, but is present to us here and now by grace. He reigns with divine authority, protecting us, guiding us, and interceding for us until he returns in glory.
