CONSTITUTION WEEK: Sept. 17-23

This week we celebrate the signing of our Constitution 228 years ago. The Constitution has stood as a testament to the tenacity of Americans throughout history to maintain our liberties, freedoms, and rights.

The tradition was started many years ago by the Daughters of the American Revolution (DAR). A law designating Constitution Week was passed by Congress and signed by President Dwight W. Eisenhower in 1956.

The DAR uses this week to emphasize citizen's responsibilities for protecting and defending the Constitution; to inform the people that the Constitution is one of the foundations for America's great heritage and way of life; and to encourage the study of the historical events which led to the framing of the Constitution 1787.
