WORSHIP NOTE: The hymn "Wake, Awake for Night Is Flying," or *WACHET AUF*, was based on the Parable of the Wise and Foolish Virgins in Matthew 25:1-13. The opening stanza calls the followers of Christ to be roused and alert for his second coming. Stanza 2 describes the joyous scene when the Bridegroom returns and takes his bride, the church, into the wedding feast. Finally, the third stanza adores the Lamb of God and describes the glorious scene in heaven, as given in Revelation 19 and 21, where the saints will worship in song forever. *Philipp Nicolai* wrote the text and tune in 1599. The words and tune are in our purple hymnal, Hymn #349.

COMMITMENT UPDATE

I have been a member of Saint Luke's for 40 years, and I have seen Saint Luke's members step up many times in the past... but once again I am amazed at the generosity and tireless commitment of members, staff, and church leaders.

Almost every area of the church has managed expenses under budget in 2015 and we believe that Saint Luke's will end the year with a balanced budget. In order to do so, about \$200,000 of income is needed in December. This can be achieved if every member meets their 2015 pledge by year-end. So, if you have not yet completed your pledge, I urge you to do so as soon as possible. If you are looking for an additional year-end tax deduction, Saint Luke's will gladly put your contribution to good use doing God's work. Please give prayerful consideration to helping Saint Luke's with an additional contribution.

At the beginning of this Commitment Season, we knew that staff expenses would increase due to the salary, benefits, and moving expenses for a new pastor. In order to maintain existing programs, missions, and staff support, every member was asked to increase their pledge by at least 10% - and more than 100 family units did so. Thank you to all who have made your pledge for 2016, and especially to those who increased theirs by 10%.

Even with the tremendous response from members, we did not achieve our pledged income goal for 2016. While some expenses cannot be reduced, the staff and church leaders have reduced almost all other expenses by nearly 10%. Some of the reductions come through improved efficiencies and by deferring items. Other reductions are more painful, such as the removal of staff pay increases and the elimination or reduction of some programs and benevolences.

Balancing budgets is always a difficult and necessary thing to do, and we are pleased to report that Saint Luke's is very close to doing so. However, the important thing is that Saint Luke's will continue to do God's work and be a beacon of faith, hope, and love for our community and around the world.

It is a great time to be at Saint Luke's. Merry Christmas to you all!
