Today is a time to recognize those leaders and martyrs of the church, and members of the armed forces, who have enabled us to worship in modern times in freedom, as well as to enjoy each other and our guests in fellowship. A warm welcome is extended to our visitors and thanks to those inside and outside our congregation who have come to assist and make this a special service of worship. The History

The ceremony of Kirkin’ o’ the Tartan is of American origin, though based on Scottish history and legend. Scotland came under British rule following the Battle of Culloden in 1746. The Scots were not allowed to wear their tartans, which represented Scottish heritage, for 50 years. The stubborn Scots would secretly carry a piece of their tartan to the Kirk (church)

where the minister would slip in a blessing (a Kirkin’). The first Kirkin’ in the US was in 1943 at the New York Avenue Presbyterian Church.

Blessing of the Tartans

The worship service is very traditional and much is based on the Church of Scotland. Central to its theme is the presentation of various tartans for a blessing. The Kirkin’ is intended to encourage all participants to reflect with thanksgiving on their own family and ethnic heritage, and to celebrate God’s grace poured out for all generations.

The Beadle

A kilted Beadle leads the worship procession carrying the Bible to the front of the sanctuary and pulpit. Reminiscent of an old custom of the Church of Scotland, this tradition highlights the Bible as the Word of our Lord and the center of our faith.

The Evolution of the Kilt

No doubt the most identifiable garment worn by the Scots is the kilt, regardless of the fabric. The kilt of modern times is made with eight yards of tartan, pleated together in the back, left unpleated in the front, and designed like a wrap-around apron. The modern kilt is made to cover only the lower half of the body, from the waist down to the knees. But in the late 1500’s, the Feileadh Mhor, or the Great Kilt (as seen on William Wallace in *Braveheart*), covered the body from the knees to the neck, and sometimes even the head.

THE SEASON OF LENT AT SAINT LUKE'S Lent is a forty day period (not including Sundays) that begins Ash Wednesday and continues to Easter. It is marked by traditional practices of prayer, fasting and generosity. This year, we are focusing on the *practice of prayer*. During worship our sermons, music and liturgy will explore the meaning and power of the Lord's Prayer as it orients us toward who God is and what God is doing through Jesus. We invite you to join us in worship and prayer this Holy Season as we prepare for Christ's journey to the cross and then the joy of His resurrection.

DO YOU HAVE DIFFICULTY HEARING CLEARLY IN THE SANCTUARY?

If so, we have a solution for you. When the sanctuary was designed our building committee opted for hard surfaces to create an ideal environment for music – and it worked. The only problem is that the spoken voice reverberates off of the hard surfaces. Numerous attempts to enhance verbal hearing through electronic means and by adding sound-absorbing surfaces to the side walls have helped somewhat, but the problem still exists.

Recently we have installed a technology called a “Hearing Loop” which has been used successfully in Europe for years and is now catching on in the U.S. Wire loops installed under the pews in the main level and the choir loft, used with a device containing a telecoil make it possible to hear the spoken word exactly as it is spoken, thus eliminating the overlapping echo.

We have replaced the old analog receivers with ten telecoil receivers which can be used with standard ear buds, such as those used with iPhones and iPods, to deliver clear sound to both ears. We encourage you to bring your own ear buds or to purchase one from the basket for \$1 and try out the Hearing Loop system. For those who have hearing aids, most recent digital hearing aids have telecoils that need to be activated by your audiologist, and can be easily switched on for use in the sanctuary.



This technology is spreading to theaters, museums and other public facilities where hearing is difficult. You can recognize those facilities by the telecoil symbol shown here. You can acquire your own receiver for \$100 by contacting Roby Price (robypri@splpres.org / 770.393.1424, ext. 244).
