The energy, creativity and love she brings to our church continue to be rich blessings — to our children, their parents and our entire congregation. One day after wrapping up another successful Vacation Bible School, Catherine Anne Thomas reflected on her ten years as Director of Children's Ministries at Saint Luke's...

Q: You obviously enjoy working at Saint Luke's or you wouldn't have stayed for ten years. What do you like best about your job?

CA: Obviously, our children are the part I like best! But also, it's working with our parents, other adults, our staff, and our youth. Everyone is so supportive. We always say that Saint Luke's has great people, and it's really true. Also, I love that I have pretty much an open license to be creative in my work. It's fun and challenging to find new ways to present the message in a memorable way. I don't like doing things the same way twice.

Q: What's your favorite program or aspect of Saint Luke's ministry? How have you contributed to making it a success?

CA: Since it just wrapped up yesterday, Vacation Bible School is on my mind and it truly is one of my favorites. There is so much to be done in a short four days. We can be creative and show lots of energy and Saint Luke's hospitality. We get to welcome families who aren't members into our church, and many of our volunteers are non-members, as well. We also have lots of familiar faces, with church kids and so many Saint Luke's Little Saints. And the youth helpers are amazing... our "former children" are delightful volunteers. This "melting pot" environment provides a great opportunity for friendships to blossom, among the children and among the volunteers. It's a very unique opportunity we have every year.

CA: The way I have contributed to making it a success has been to take my own experience as a parent of VBS participants and come up with some ideas about how to make the week even better. I have loved thinking about how to expand, dial it up a notch, take advantage of our great facilities and technology, add a service component, and reach more and more kids each year.

Q: What is Saint Luke's greatest asset? What are our opportunities?

CA: The optimistic and friendly nature of our church family. People here seem to be very happy and a church with happy people can do anything. I see this in the staff too. We are a very collegial group, working together and supporting each other. All of us just do whatever it takes to get the job done. The staff's good working relationship spills over into the congregation, I believe.

CA: We've been working on ideas for events which would bring the whole congregation together around a common purpose, particularly in the 9:30 to 10:30 Sunday morning timeframe. I am excited about planning some unique activities meant to engage all age groups. People love helping other people, so service would be the central theme of these family-friendly and bring-a-friend type of events. Working together for a common goal is a fun way to keep energizing our great church family while welcoming others to our community.

Q: How have things changed around the church in the last ten years?

CA: Well, my office has gotten a lot messier! And also, Children's Ministries has become more a part of the fabric of our church. It doesn't happen just in Sheppard Hall anymore. Changes over the past ten years include Children's Ministries Sunday, which is a moving worship experience for all who

attend; the coloring tables in the lobby, which have provided an opportunity for us to show to members and visitors that we want kids to be right there with us in the most visible part of our church; and an intentional effort to keep children's artwork displayed throughout the church. A fun new thing we tried last summer - Our Children's Wax Museum of the Bible - was met with such an enthusiastic response we are doing it again this year. Every connection we make with another generation is a victory for everyone.

Q: How do you see Saint Luke's living out its mission, "To be a beacon of faith, hope, and love -- every member an active disciple in Christ's ministry?"

CA: We offer plenty of opportunities for people to be active disciples - just look at our web site! There are a growing number of things families can do together, so even the littlest ones can participate in mission. I am excited that so many families with children have made the trip to Thornwell. Mountain Top is another example of a mission partner that encourages families to participate. I have found that a key to engaging people in ministry is to meet

them where they are. I try to keep this in mind when I am recruiting volunteers and when I'm talking to parents about bringing their kids to church. Every time we are together, it's a chance to be a beacon of faith, hope and love. I am reminded of a comment my son Reed made when he was in about 2nd grade. I dragged him

along to help with the set-up of a traveling tent on several Sunday mornings in a row. One of those mornings he said, "Gee, Mom, you really go to a lot of trouble to convince these kids." Since then, every time I am preparing something for our children, I think about that and smile. We are convincing kids - we are convincing them that God loves them just the way they are and that we do, too!
