



Disciple: "Remember Who You Are: The Prophets and The Letters of Paul". Meets: Tuesdays, 7-9 p.m. for 32 weeks beginning September 10. Led by Carol Sweigert and Sandra Clay, the course materials are \$38. Participants will read the major and minor Old Testament prophets and the thirteen letters attributed to Paul. Several themes weave their way through the study - the call to remember, the call to repent, the need for renewed vision, and the place of community.

Disciple: "Christian Believer: Knowing God with Heart and Mind". This is a daytime Bible study, with the dates and times determined by the participants. Led by Phil Brown, the course materials are \$37. Participants will gain a sense that Christians before us have wrestled with some of the same issues of belief that Christians wrestle with today.
