50 YEARS OF FAITH & FAMILY

Welcome to all! Today, Saint Luke's Presbyterian Church celebrates 50 years of worship, fellowship, learning, and service. The first worship service of the new worshipping community was held on Sunday, September 7, 1969 at the Dunwoody Elementary School, the current site of the Dunwoody library. Dr. E. Moss Robertson (1920 – 2016) was the founding pastor.

The staff, leaders, and congregation of Saint Luke's welcome former members, neighbors and friends, colleagues in the Presbytery of Greater Atlanta, and outreach partners who have joined us today. We celebrate what God has done, is doing, and will do through the ministry of Saint Luke's in the community and around the world.

We welcome to the pulpit today Dr. Christopher A. Price. Chris served Saint Luke's as Senior Pastor from April, 1991 through November, 2008. Under Chris' leadership, Saint Luke's expanded its outreach focus in the community, the region and the world. Chris was educated at the University of Georgia, Columbia Theological Seminary, and University of St. Andrews in Scotland, and served the Madison, Georgia Presbyterian Church before joining Saint Luke's. He currently serves as Pastor of the Friendship Presbyterian Church in Concord, Georgia. Chris has three daughters— Kate Carango, Jennifer DeGennaro, and Lauren Fogarty— and ten grandchildren.
