In Preparation for Worship

Second in importance to John Calvin in the history of Presbyterianism is John Knox, who lived in Scotland in the mid-1500s. Knox led the Reformation in Scotland following the theology and principles laid forth by Calvin, leading protests against the abuses of power conducted by the British monarchy and the Catholic Church. Knox's ideas set the moral tone for the Church of Scotland and also shaped its democratic form of government. The Presbyterian form of church government and Reformed theology were formally adopted as the national Church of Scotland in 1690, which remains Presbyterian today. Reformed Presbyterian churches were first established in the colonies the early 1600s with Presbyterians shaping the religious and political life of the newly established nation.
