Commitment is Spiritual

Commitment is our response to God's goodness and grace in the ways we use our time, our talents, our connections (invite someone to Saint Luke's!), and our financial resources. It begins with the foundational principle expressed in scripture, again and again, "the earth is the Lord's and all that is in it, the world and those who live in it" (Psalm 24:1). All that we have is a gift of grace, and in gratitude we return a generous portion to support the work God intends for us and the world.

Commitment is also Financial

Although commitment is not limited to finances, how we use our money is an important way of expressing our faith. Nearly a third of Jesus' teachings have to do with this topic. He knew the truth, that our money, like our words and our actions, reflects our values and purpose. Jesus taught his followers to give selflessly and generously, like God does, so that their lives would be arranged as a reflection of God.

The Israelites, Jesus, and his followers gave a "tithe," or "one-tenth, to God's work from the "first fruits" of the harvest, before taking anything for themselves. When (first) and how much (a tenth of all we have) is prescribed purposefully in the Bible, commanding a bold response to God's abundance and bold commitment to God's work from everyone.

While some in our congregation do tithe their annual income, for many a tithe is an elusive challenge. But we ask that you consider a tithe, or getting on a path toward a tithe, as the kind of bold giving our shared faith asks of us. A simple path toward a tithe is to increase your giving each year by 1% of your annual income until reaching 10%.

The average pledge at Saint Luke's is roughly \$8,100 (\$1,250,000 from 154 households), or about \$600 per month. Some give more and some give less, of course, but generous commitments are required from all of us in order to do all that Saint Luke's does!

Commitment is Essential

The Finance Committee of the church's Session develops and adopts a balanced operating budget each calendar year. This budget is based on the ministry plans and needs of the church, and the projected pledges and other forms of income. The budget primarily funds personnel, building maintenance, church programs, outreach, and a modest mortgage.

So what we can plan to do in the coming year is a function of what we pledge to give. In this way, pledged giving is far more valuable and important to the church than giving as you go.

An annual commitment campaign is conducted every fall, during which the church is celebrated and our commitments to the coming year are summoned and offered. Once a balanced budget is adopted each year, our income and expenses are reviewed carefully and constantly by the Finance Committee of the church's Session in keeping with it.

Commitment is Simple

1. Make a pledge
2. Set up a regular giving plan
3. Increase your pledge each year, work toward a tithe
4. Consider long term giving to the endowment or planned giving

"Commitment" is the shared value by which Saint Luke's members and friends grow in faith. Our commitments together are the life blood of the church, empowering the church to reflect God's love for one another and neighbors near and far.
